LAWS & ANNOUNCEMENTS

OHS Enforcement

Dec 18: Since April 1, Manitoba has carried out 4,343 WSH inspections, resulting in the issuance of 229 Stop Work Orders and 7,170 Improvement Orders. There were also 7 reported OHS work refusals and 56 alleged reprisals.

Action Point: Implement an <u>OHS inspections policy</u> in case inspectors show up at your door

Drugs & Alcohol

Dec 16: Manitoba is expanding a program to help residents quit smoking via use of a Tobacco Quit Card and Counseling (TQCC) card that can be redeemed for \$300 worth of nicotine replacement medications (patches, gum, lozenges, inhaler and oral mist) at any pharmacy in the province, as well as counselling sessions with a health professional.

Action Point: Take 5 steps to <u>prevent workplace smoking</u> and avoid fines under smoke-free laws

Workers Comp

Feb 28: That's the deadline for Manitoba employers to submit their actual 2022 workers comp payroll figures to the WCB.

Fall Protection: Roofer Fined \$24,000 for Fall Protection Violation

A worker clearing debris from the section of a roof where the guardrail had been temporarily removed fell 20 feet to the ground, resulting in rib and spinal fractures. The employer was fined \$24,000 for not providing proper fall protection [Norwin Roofing Ltd., Govt. News Release, December 28, 2022].
