Transportation Safety

Jun 7: Under newly passed <u>Bill 33</u>, driving 50-80 km/h over the speed limit will result in vehicle impoundment for 7 days, in plus a \$500 fine and 5 points off a licence. People whose licences have expired for 5 years or more must now re-take the written and road test to get a new one.

First Aid

May 30: Comments ended on <u>proposed changes</u> to the *First Aid Regulation* designed to harmonize record keeping and minimum training requirements (and definition of "high hazard work") in New Brunswick with the OHS rules of other jurisdictions.

JHSC

May 15: WorkSafeNB launched a free new <u>online quiz tool</u> that employers can use to evaluate the effectiveness of their workplace JHSC and determine what steps may be necessary to achieve improvements.

Workers Comp

May 1: WorkSafeNB announced the 2023 medical transportation amounts: i. 57 cents per km for the first 8,000 kms driven; ii. 52 cents per km for 8,001 to 16,000 kms; iii. 45 cents for each km driven thereafter.
