#### **LAWS & ANNOUNCEMENTS**

#### COVID-19

Dec 15: The GNWT released a <u>new report</u> analyzing the long-term social and psychological impact of public health measures put in place during the pandemic to minimize risks of COVID-19 infection, including with regard to mental health and addictions, alcohol-related harm and family violence.

#### **Cold Stress**

Dec 21: The Northwest Territories officially approved the <u>code of practice called</u>
<u>Thermal Conditions</u> as meeting the cold stress requirements contained in the OHS regulations.

**Action Point:** Implement an effective <u>cold stress compliance game plan</u> at your workplace

### **Workers Comp**

Feb 28: That's the deadline for Northwest Territories employers to submit their workers comp payroll reports and data for 2022 to WSCC without incurring 2% late fees, interest and penalties.



# **Workers Comp**

Nov 17: The WSCC released its <u>2023-2027 Strategic Plan</u> outlining what it wants to accomplish over the next 5 years. One of the key objectives is to reduce lost-time injury claims rates (which was 1.8 in 2021) to 1.68 per 100 workers by 2027.

## **Workers Comp**

Jan 1: The 2023 WSCC meal and accommodation allowances for injured workers who have to travel for medical treatment:

• Breakfast: \$25.55 (\$22.80 for Canada/US travel outside NWT)

• Lunch: \$31.00 (\$23.05)

• Dinner: \$66.35 (\$56.60)

• Incidentals: \$17.30 (\$17.30).

#### **Environmental**

Jan 4: <u>Comments</u> ended on <u>proposed changes</u> to the *Waste Reduction and Recovery Act*, including with regard to extended producer liability, disposal bans and penalties.
