LAWS & ANNOUNCEMENTS

Fire Safety

Mar 30: Royal Assent for <u>Bill 67</u>, which amends the *Fire Prevention Act* to prevent money damages lawsuits against fire officials, authorize the Fire Marshal to delegate their duties and powers and create a new process for appealing the Fire Marshal's plan review orders.

Action Point: Go to the <u>OHSI Fire Safety Compliance centre</u> for resources you can use to prevent fires and explosions at your workplace

Transportation Safety

Apr 13: <u>Comments</u> ended on proposed *Motor Vehicles Act* regulatory changes that would require employers to install electronic logging devices in commercial vehicles of 4,500 kg or more to ensure that drivers comply with Hours-of-Service safety rules designed to prevent driver fatigue.

Mental Stress

Mar 20: Despite moderate declines in 2022, medical visits related to anxiety are still above pre-pandemic levels. Those are among the findings of a new GNWT <u>report</u> analyzing the long term social impacts of the public health measures it implement during the pandemic to prevent the spread of COVID.



Environmental

Mar 30: The Assembly passed legislation (Bill 60) to revise the GNWT's carbon tax system with the federal "backstop," or minimum stringency standards. The tax on carbon dioxide equivalent emissions will increase to \$65 per tonne in 2023 and eventually rise to \$170 per tonne by 2030.
