COVID-19

Jan 16: Yukon officially lifted the COVID-19 public health emergency. Coronavirus is still a threat, but we can handle it with conventional means without resorting to emergency measures, the government explained. Get vaccinated and stay home if you're sick, it advised residents.

New Laws

Feb 8: From now through May 9, Yukon will be holding <u>public consultations</u> on <u>proposed</u> new legislation governing minerals and all aspects of mining activity in the territory from prospecting to the operation of a mine and the eventual closure and remediation of a site.

Workers Comp

Feb 28: That's the final day for Yukon employers to submit their actual 2022 workers comp payroll numbers to the YWCHSB on the Employer's Payroll Return and Contract Labour Report (EPR) form and avoid the potential for late fees, interest and penalties.
