

#### **OHS Enforcement**

Aug 28: The Yukon WSCB will hold an open house to discuss a <u>proposed plan</u> to establish a new framework for imposing Administrative Monetary Penalties for WSC violations. Those who can't attend can provide feedback by completing a WSCB <u>online survey</u> by September 5.

**Action Point:** Find out about the current <u>Administrative Monetary Penalty rules</u> for OHS violations across Canada.

# **Emergency Response**

Aug 4: The fire season in Yukon has been intense with 130 wildfires and 122,459 hectares burned so far, according to the government's mid-season briefing. A total of 192 firefighters have been deployed in Yukon, including personnel from BC, Alberta, Newfoundland, PEI and New Brunswick. There are currently 93 active fires, mostly in Dawson and Mayo.

**Action Point:** Find out how to implement a <u>Wildfire Smoke Protection Game Plan</u> to guard your workers against smoke exposure, both indoors and outdoors.

### **New Laws**

Jul 28: Yukon, Northwest Territories and Nunavut signed a Memorandum of Understanding to create a new Territorial Trade Zone, a kind of Northern Common Market through which goods, services and labour will flow freely. Among other things, the territories will create a shared credential registry allowing qualified professionals to ply their trade in all 3 territories.

# **New Laws**

Jul 28: The Yellowknife Chamber of Commerce will receive up to \$150,000 from the Canadian Northern Economic Development Agency (CanNor) to support annual small business events over the next 3 years, including a Small Business Week to be held in the fall and a Trailblazers Symposium coinciding with International Women's Day.

Aug 7: Construction will soon begin on a new community recreational space in Dawson, supported by a combined investment of \$63.9 million from the federal and Yukon governments, with \$47 million coming from Ottawa and \$16 million from the territory.
